

RÉSUMÉ HACK: Don't create a static PDF. Create a web page instead (print it to PDF when necessary) and update it as frequently as you can. To be able to update it frequently, you have to do things, which is the only way to make yourself prolific.

SUPERPOWER: The ability to synthesize the science behind the research question, and the FDA regulations that need to be satisfied, into a robust and efficient statistical design, then explain to the researcher how the design addresses each of these essential componentsbacked up by solid literature.

RÉSUMÉ HACK: Tailor your résumé to the job requirements and the company. Sending the same résumé to everyone is not the way to be noticed. Showing, based on your experience and education, how you match the requirements sets you apart—you make the reviewer's job easier and it shows you put effort into the response.

WHEN WE SAY "DATA," YOU SAY: Integrity

RÉSUMÉ HACK: Tailor your résumé for each job to which you apply; include a brief bio that weaves your career and educational paths in a way that shows your passion for statistics/research/methods/whatever and how it fits exactly into the position you are applying to. ... Employers will notice.
